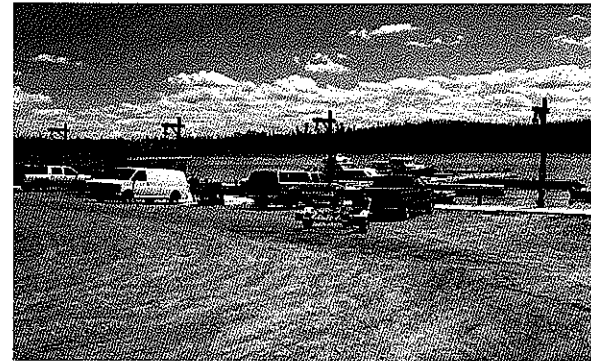
POPLAR LODGE PARK

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to Poplar Lodge Park.

The Park's natural beauty and easy access to Lake Nipigon with its excellent and varied fishing, provide a unique and peaceful experience for all campers and fishers.

For those wishing to experience all the camping comforts, the Park has a little something for everyone — 125 campsites, 45 of which are serviced (electrical and water hook-ups), flush toilets and shower facility, dump station for trailers, firewood, playground for the children, and miles of clean white sandy beach.

High Hill Harbour Marina, 5 km from the Park, has docking and full service facilities for the bigger boats. The facility is almost

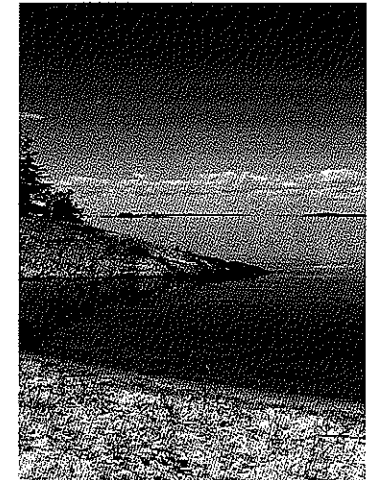


complete and currently is able to provide the first and only fueling and pump out facilities to the boating public on Lake Nipigon.

For the enthusiastic fisher, the Fish and

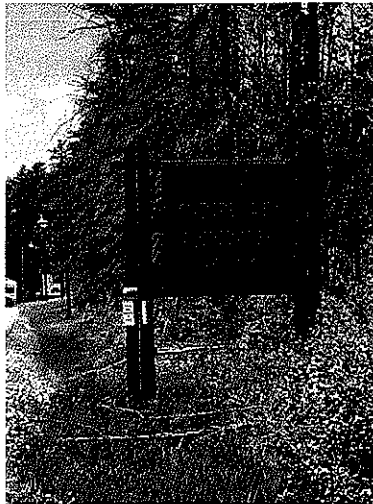
Game Club hosts a yearly Trout Hunt on the third weekend in July.

We continuously strive to make these facilities better for our guests. Please let us know how we are doing, by jotting down a note and mailing it to the address on the front of this booklet.



ON ARRIVING

- ⇒ Please present yourself to the Park Attendant upon entering the Park for direction and registration to a campsite.
- ⇒ Pets are welcome but must be kept on a leash.
- ⇒ We respectfully ask for your co-operation in helping to manage activities in the Park.
- ⇒ Please note that the Park is closed to all day visitors from 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. and all excessive noise must cease in the Park by 11:00 p.m.



NO PERSON SHALL

1. Remove or damage any tables, benches, fire places, markers or signs.
2. Deface, damage or remove any bridge, building structure, natural objects, or any other property of the Park.
3. Throw or deposit or cause to be deposited any cans, bottles, metal containers, waste or litter anywhere in the Park except into garbage containers provided for that purpose.
4. Permit any pets to run at large in the Park.



NO PERSON SHALL (cont)

5. Start a fire in a campsite or picnic area except in a fire place provided for that purpose.
6. Use abusive, insulting or profane language and disturb other guests in the Park.
7. Operate a motorized vehicle on the Park beach or picnic grounds.
8. Place or cause to be placed any large appliances anywhere on the campsite. All large appliances not pertaining to or forming part of the standard equipment of an RV are strictly prohibited.
9. Store gasoline or fuel on any campsite. All trucks with fuel storing capacity for refueling shall not be allowed on the campsites.
10. Have boats and/or trailers on campsites. All boats and/or trailers must be parked in the designated area.
11. Have more than six persons or one single family group (parents & children) per campsite. The limit is three pieces of shelter equipment per campsite or one self contained unit.
12. Have more than two vehicles per campsite. All others are asked to park in the parking area.
13. Have alcoholic beverages other than at a registered campsite.
14. Allow any campers, trailers, boats or other equipment into the Park before the official opening day or left past the official closing day of the Park. Transgressors shall have such property removed without notice at their expense.

CAMPERS WHO DO NOT VOLUNTARILY FOLLOW CAMP-GROUND REGULATIONS WILL HAVE TO LEAVE THE PARK.

CAMPSITES



Campsites are available on a first come, first served basis.

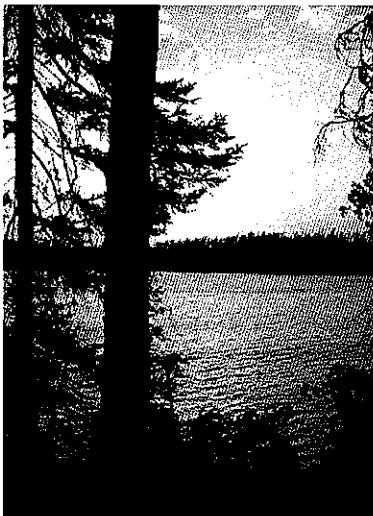
THERE WILL BE ABSOLUTELY NO RESERVATIONS OF CAMPSITES AT ANY TIME.

Park Attendants will do their best to accommodate everyone coming in; however, campers may have to take a basic site until such time as a serviced site becomes available.



FIREWOOD

Firewood is available at the Park Office during operating hours. The price is \$5.00 per bundle. Park staff will have firewood available for purchase during the hours they are in attendance.



CAMPFIRES

Campfires are allowed only in the designated areas. When necessary and when conditions warrant, all fire bans posted by the MNR or the Municipal Fire Chief are to be strictly obeyed. All fire ban notices will be posted at the Park. **PLEASE HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES!** Never leave a campfire unattended and make sure your campfire is DEAD out when you are finished with it.



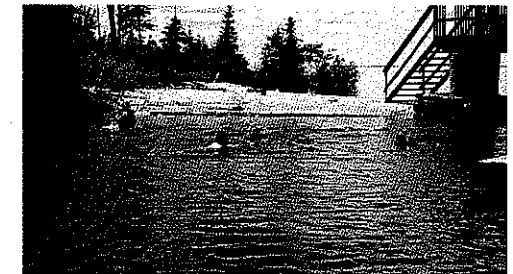
CAMPING ETIQUETTE



Respect the peace and quiet of the campground. Noise can travel a considerable distance through the woods. Radios and stereo systems should be audible only on your site.

SAFETY

Watch your children, especially at the beach and along the roadway. The beach area is not supervised nor patrolled, and the roadway is very busy as it is the main entrance to the Park and the cottage area.

- ⇒ Please leave your campsite clean and use the garbage containers provided at all times. Your cooperation will help protect the Park's natural beauty and help to prevent bears from entering the campground.
